

On Wednesday, the Vermont senator trekked to Culver City to sit down with Young Turks host Cenk Uygur for a 30-minute interview.





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

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Raised in a home by Armenian immigrant parents, Ana Kasparian adopted their diligent work ethic. 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

If you use social media with even a little frequency, you've likely seen videos made by Tomi Lahren at TheBlaze, and if so, it's just as likely that you've seen the rebuttal videos made by Hasan Piker of The Young Turks. Piker's videos gained notoriety once he began responding to many of the controversial and inflammatory claims made by Lahren in her videos. 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
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
On Election Night, The Young Turks Smash Records With 4.5 Million Total Views



On November 8th, the United States turned its eyes to the results of the 2016 presidential election, and one place where its citizens tuned in for their political coverage was The Young Turks. The progressive-leaning news channel had a big night; across three separate live streams — one each on YouTube, Facebook, and Twitter — it drew more than 4.5 million total hits, smashing its own viewership record.

The bulk of The Young Turks' viewership came on YouTube, where its hosts, including Cenk Uygur and Ana Kasparian, led a 12-hour broadcast that broke down the election results. At its peak viewership, The Young Turks' YouTube stream counted 132,979 concurrent viewers. While that is a smaller figure compared to what YouTube drew during the three presidential debates, it is the biggest audience ever for a Young Turks stream, eclipsing the 72,635 viewers the news channel drew for its March 2016 interview with progressive presidential candidate Bernie Sanders. The viewers who tuned into The Young Turks stuck around, too, with the average watch time coming in just under 20 minutes per user.


The Young Turks Network has recruited Chris Puckett, formerly of BuzzFeed and Fullscreen, as the first advertising sales executive in the news-focused digital media company's 10-year-plus history.

Puckett started at TYT on Jan. 4 as VP of advertising and brand partnerships, based in New York. He reports to The Young Turks chief marketing officer Praveen Singh.

Most recently, Puckett was Fullsceen's East Coast director of brand partnerships and sales, working with clients including Mondelez, Pepsi, American Express, Warner Bros. and Dell. Previously, he was head of sales at BuzzFeed, where he was also the first salesperson hired by the company. Puckett also has worked in sales at Facebook and Google.

"We've been focused for years on building audience and content, but we haven't really focused on ad sales — we've let YouTube do the heavy lifting," TYT Network COO Steve Oh said. "We think Chris is the right guy... He knows how to sell content that is broad and sometimes edgy."

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
An Internet TV Pioneer Says He's Well on the Way to 'World Domination'

The Young Turks founder Cenk Uygur talks media, movements, and the 2016 election.



n an age of disruption and constant flux, it still pays to be the first. Just ask The Young Turks crew and host-C.E.O. Cenk Uygur, who mastered Internet TV while Netflix was still mailing people DVDs. Now, as cable subscriptions flatline and the median age of a Fox News viewer is 68, Uygur's brainchild—which began in his Los Angeles apartment and broke through as a late-2000s YouTube phenomenon—is positioned for what he calls "world domination." The TYT network garners 80 million unique views every month across its various channels, and is the number one online network for the 18-34 demographic. The flagship program is the largest online news show in the world. They're closing fast on CNN in the overall standings, too—something





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The Young Turks Network Clocks 6 Billion Lifetime Views, Bolsters Pluto TV Lineup

TYT Network, the progressive digital news network behind flagship show The Young Turks, announced today a staggering milestone: its shows have been viewed 6 billion times since the company's online launch in 2005.

Perhaps more impressive is the pace at which this figure has been reached. Between 2007 and 2012, for instance, the network accumulated 2 billion views. But in the era of President Donald Trump, TYT Network clocked 2 billion views in 2016 alone. The company says it had more online views than CNN, MSNBC, and Fox last month, citing figures from comScore, and more unique viewers than all of those networks combined among audiences aged 13 to 24. Across all social platforms, TYT Network says it amasses more than 200 million views per month.

At the same time, The Young Turks announced that it will stream its TYT Live series on web-based TV platform Pluto TV beginning today. Broadcasting weekdays from 6-8pm ET, the show features hosts Cenk Uygur and Ana Kasparian

After launching a <u>crowdfunding campaign</u> last December to fund four new investigative teams, digital progressive news network **The Young Turks** (TYT) has announced three new hires in honor of <u>surpassing \$1.5 million</u> of its \$2 million goal.

Jonathan Larsen (above I.), who previously served as the senior executive producer of politics for *Al Jazeera America*, has been named managing editor of TYT — a newly created role. Additionally, former **MSNBC** host **Dylan Ratigan** (c.) and **David Sirota** (above r.), an investigative editor for the *International Business Times* — and who will remain on staff there — have been tapped as news commentators for TYT.

In his role as managing editor, Larsen will oversee all editorial and programming for investigative journalists and commentators. He previously produced *Countdown With Keith Olbermann*, *The Daily Show With Jon Stewart*, *ABC World News Now*, and *Anderson Cooper 360*. Ratigan is a sustainability entrepreneur who resigned from MSNBC in 2012, and Sirota's work has also appeared in *The New York Times Magazine*, *Wired*, *Vice*, and **CNN**.

"Our goal is to continue expanding the scope of our programming and distribution channels, as well as finding more effective ways to monetize it. To accomplish this, we needed to stop relying on a hodge-podge of generic automation software that posed multiple points of failure across our system. We switched to Vantage because it's purpose-built to support the needs of a high throughput media processing operation like ours," explained Jonny Greenwald, post-production technical director for TYT Network.

Since this high-volume content must be edited, branded, and transcoded into numerous iterations for multi-platform distribution, TYT Network decided to migrate its operations to an automated, file-based workflow based on the Vantage Media Processing Platform from Telestream.

As part of its intensive, round-the-clock media operation, The Young Turks' live two-hour newscast must be subsequently chunked and repackaged into video segments of varying lengths for on-demand viewing. Ten clips can easily become 30 clips with all the formats, versions and derivatives needed by their distribution platforms, which today include YouTube, Facebook, Twitter, Vimeo, Roku, Pluto.tv, Hulu and Amazon. The same goes for the network's numerous specialty channels, including sports, movies, technology, and pop culture, which must also be segmented into a variety of iterations and formats for on-demand viewing across the multiplatform ecosystem.

"Since this workflow largely involves repetitive tasks—such as editing, transcoding, branding, and conforming—it lends itself very easily to template-driven automation. Vantage puts all the tools and processes we need into one cohesive automated workflow that doesn't require any manual oversight or intervention. Once we tell Vantage where a media file needs to go-whether it's to YouTube, Facebook, Hulu or some other platform-it picks up the file, and conforms it to the specifications required for that destination, and sends it out with uncompromised quality," said Greenwald.



It started as a talk show on Sirius satellite radio in 2002 and transitioned to YouTube in 2005, where it has amassed 3 million subscribers and over 3 billion total views. The show is LIVE on weekdays from 6pm-8pm ET and is hosted by Cenk Uygur and Ana Kasparian.

The Young Turks takes pride in speaking truth to power in the way they deliver the news. As an independent news show, TYT covers the issues that everyday Americans care about and are not dictated by outside influences. Rather, their storytelling is made possible through the enthusiastic support of their 'TYT Army.' TYT combines all the news people care about in one place - constantly challenging the status quo, holding the government accountable, and empowering individuals with the tools they need to make a difference.

STRATEGY

On election night, TYT crushed their live viewing record with over a millions hours of view time watched in one day. Prior to election day, TYT provided 100 reasons to not vote for Donald Trump through a segment called, "Loser Donald." TYT was also on the ground for all the debates and spoke with campaign representatives from both Trump and Clinton campaigns.

Aside from its election coverage, TYT also investigated and followed-up on reports of a pipeline being constructed on sacred grounds in North Dakota. TYT reporter, Jordan Chariton, was on the scene to witness numerous instances of water protectors being abused by the police. He also received exclusive drone footage that showed the pipeline nearly completed, within half a mile of the Missouri River.

The Young Turks is able to reach millions of Americans through its live, daily news show, covering the stories the mainstream media often misses. Through the hashtag, '#tytlive,' audience members are able to engage with the hosts, offering their own commentary to the stories being covered. Clips of the show are made available directly after it ends. On weekends, or when there's breaking news, hosts provide their commentary using YouTube Live.






Do you see yourself as Tomi Lahren's opposite number? Maybe even a Tomi Lahren of the left?

I definitely miss a Scottish breakfast. You can't get it as often, so I miss



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

extremely conservative, and you're talking about the social justice warrior left, which is extremely progressive. And both sides are doing the exact same thing – pointing the finger at the most extreme liberal, for example within the right, and saying: "Look! This is representative of all the things liberals represent." They don't care about the fact there's income inequality, or that I'm poor and I don't have access to affordable healthcare, they only care about the 39 different gender pronouns assigned to each individual sexual identity.

And that's an exaggeration but we do the exact same thing on the left. We point the finger at the alt-right and say every conservative is racist, everyone that voted for Donald Trump is racist. That's just not true. Everyone that voted for Donald Trump isn't racist.



And do you get sent a lot of unprintable fan messages?

Absolutely. It's funny because I was talking to a friend about this. Recently I more than tripled my Instagram growth in a very short period of time.
